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Games That Flash...

- Materials: flashlights, and family or friends
- Play a classic game of Flashlight Tag! This game is a hybrid of "tag" and "hide and seek." The person who is "it" closes their eyes while everyone else hides. "It" has a flashlight. The others hide, and can change hiding spots during the game. Once they're tagged with the flashlight, they become "it" and a new round starts.



- The game, Signals, requires each player to have a flashlight. This game is not only fun, it teaches you how fireflies communicate in the wild.
 - Pair up the players. Each pair creates a flashlight signal. Signals are a series of long and short flashes. For example, two long flashes, then three short.
 - Partners separate, all players scatter throughout a designated area. One person shouts "go!". All players start flashing signals to find their partners as quickly as possible. The first pair to find each other wins.

and GLOW in the Dark!

- Materials: glow sticks, plastic water bottles
- Play a game of Glow Stick Ring Toss. Set up the water bottles you'll be tossing the rings onto. Leaving them full will help keep them upright.
- Make rings out of the glow sticks and distribute to players. Players take turns tossing their glow rings and trying to get them around the bottles.
- You can make the game more or less challenging by changing the distance you toss from.
- After you finish the ring toss game, you can use the same materials and a ball to play Glow Bowling.






Campfire Classics
